Steve Field December 5 to February 24

Cross Plains resident, Steve Field, is a self-taught woodcarver who began his woodcarving career in 1988. He uses power tools to carve birds, animals, and fish out of basswood and tupelo. Once the carving is done, each object is painted and a habitat is created for displaying the piece.

Steve taught woodcarving through the Madison Area Technical College in Middleton and Cross Plains

from 1990 to 2005, and is an award-winning carver who competes in the open or masters class in local and national competitions. Steve and his highly-acclaimed art have been featured in *Woodcarving Illustrated* magazine which featured a photograph of one of his carvings on their magazine cover.
