Basic Computers – class size 6 Tuesday, March 29, 9:30-11:00 a.m.

Learn the basic operation of a Windows PC including keyboard, mouse use and desktop features. Some typing skills required.

<u>Internet Basics</u> – class size 6 <u>Tuesday, March 29, 12:30-2:00 p.m.</u>

Discover the Internet and the World Wide Web (WWW) using the Internet Explorer browser. Participants must have basic computer skills and keyboard experience.

Word Processing Basics (Word 2007) – class size 6 Wednesday, March 30, 9:30-11:00 a.m.

Learn to edit a document with cutting, copying, pasting inserting, deleting, bolding, italicizing, and underlining. A general understanding of computer operation is required.
