DATABASES AT THE LIBRARY

Need help with a car repair? For those of you who prefer the "book-in-hand" approach, your library owns a collection of Chilton repair manuals that can be checked out. If you're more of a computer person, the library offers two auto repair websites. Auto Repair Reference Center specializes in vehicles from 1945 to the present. The Chilton Library provides automotive repair information for vehicles of the last 30-50 years.

To access these databases, log into LINKcat, and click on the Databases link. Auto Repair Reference Center is listed on the SCLS System-Wide Resources page. Chilton Library can be accessed by clicking on the Locally-Subscribed Resources tab. If you need assistance, please let us know!

Cross Plains patrons also have access to the online version of Consumer Reports. This comprehensive database can be found in LINKcat by clicking on Databases and the Locally-Subscribed Resources tab. Under the Consumer Reports/Subscribing libraries heading, click on the Cross Plains link. There's even a terrific tutorial to help you make the most of this valuable website.
