YOUR ECO-FOOTPRINT ____ ONE SIZE DOESN'T FIT ALL

When the Library Board, staff, building and fund raising committees dedicated themselves to creating the first "green" library in Wisconsin, they understood the adage "if you talk-the-talk, you must walk-the-walk." Today the community has a library facility that is a living laboratory designed to highlight good environmental practices and promote ecological stewardship.

To continue walking-the-walk, the library is developing an environmental collection and looking into ways to engage and enlighten the community. A simple first step is to introduce the idea of the "eco-footprint." The eco-footprint is simply a tool to measure your own ecological performance. Periodically the library will run a short quiz that allows you to assess the size of your eco-footprint. Below is your first quiz. The more boxes you check, the healthier your eco-footprint.

"We Are All One People" 10:30 - NOON

Join us this special day for the opening reception for *Portrait of a Neighborhood*, and a related art workshop taught by artist educator Nancy Giffey. Interviews and over 50 photographs by JoAnna Been of Madison's diverse Triangle Neighborhood have been touring Dane County at such sites as the U. of Wisconsin Multicultural Center, Meriter Hospital Atrium and the UW Welcome Center.
