E Notes for a Sustainable Life

If Life Gives You Lemons - Clean with Them!

***Laundry:** Brighten whites by adding 1/2 cup lemon juice to the rinse cycle.

***Garbage Disposal:** Cut a lemon in half and run both pieces through the disposal.

***Dishes:** Improve grease cutting power by adding a teaspoon of lemon juice to your detergent.

***Countertops:** Cut a lemon in half, dip the cut side in baking soda and rub on countertops. Wipe with a damp sponge and dry. (Do not use on marble or stainless steel.)

***Grout:** Add lemon juice to 1 teaspoon cream of tartar to make a paste. Apply with a toothbrush, then rinse.
