DATABASES AT YOUR LIBRARY

This is the first of a series of brief articles highlighting databases available through your public library. New this year is the **Chilton Library**. This on-line library provides exclusive photographs, diagnostics designed by instructors, step-by-step repair procedures, Original Equipment Manufacturer (OEM) maintenance schedules, wiring diagrams, recalls and Technical Service Bulletins (TSBs) for automobiles and light trucks in one easy-to-use web site. Patrons may access the database from any computer by navigating from the Rosemary Garfoot Public Library website. Select *Online Reference Databases* from the left-hand menu, click on *View On-line Resources by Name* at the top of the screen, select *additional resources*, and choose *Chilton Library*. If you would like assistance finding this or any other database, please ask!

Another great resource you can navigate to from *Online Reference Databases* is **COIN Career Center**. This website is a comprehensive information resource for career and college research. Users can explore interests and aptitude to match their interests to occupations and education prospects. Career Library also provides resources to practice tests and skills, build resumes, and plan for technical, military or professional jobs. Take a look!
