The Dane County TimeBank is a system of bartering that helps communities and neighbors reach out, connect, and give-and-get from one another in an efficient, beneficial exchange of services and labor.

Started in 2005, the Dane County TimeBank is now one of the largest in the country and is based on the ideas of social activist and Professor of Law, Edgar S. Cahn, author of *No More Throw-Away People*. Join us and find out how you, your organization, business, family, and friends can reap the rewards, financial and community-related, by using a system of non-monetary resource sharing. All seeds must be labeled. If you need the original package, put the seeds in a paper envelope, labeled with the variety. Do not use plastic as it can trap moisture.


Tempting seed catalogs will be available to enjoy at the Library. If you have any interesting catalogs, please bring them to share.

Filmed over nearly three years, the Academy Award-nominated film *Waste Land* follows artist Vik Muniz as he journeys from his home in Brooklyn to his native Brazil and the world's largest garbage dump, Jardim Gramacho, on the outskirts of Rio de Janeiro. There he photographs an eclectic band of "catadores," self-designated pickers of recyclable materials. Muniz's collaboration with these inspiring characters as they create images of themselves out of garbage reveals both their dignity and despair as they begin to re-imagine their lives. The film offers stirring evidence of the transformative power of art and the alchemy of the human spirit. Also: Climate Wisconsin short, *Adaptation & Mitigation*.


The library continues to accept food donations for the Mazomanie Food Bank. Please consider those in need this winter.
