ENACT PROGRAM - FEB. 22


Come see "An Inconvenient Truth", Al Gore's 90 minute documentary on global warming and discover how to be part of the solution to our climate crisis Thursday February 22 from 6:30 to 8:30 pm. The program will be held in the meeting rooms at the Rosemary Garfoot Public Library , 2107 Julius St in Cross Plains.

EnAct, a free sustainable living program based in Madison (www.enactwi.org) , is hosting the event. EnAct is a free local program that provides guides with resources and ideas of simple actions that individuals can take to have a more positive impact on the environment. Interested individuals form teams that meet a total of eight times, covering the topics of solid waste, transportation, energy, water, and food, focusing on the guide.

After the movie, EnAct will lead a short presentation and discussion about how we as individuals can work to stop global warming. You will learn how to analyze your contribution to global warming pollution--- your "carbon footprint"---and focus on actions you can take to reduce your contribution.

FAMILY PROGRAM – MARCH 3RD THE SIMPLE PROPAGATION OF PLANTS

Join the Friends and Master Gardeners of the Rosemary Garfoot Public Library for a morning of learning easier ways to have more plants in your garden. We'll start with tips in starting plants from seeds and then show how to take cuttings from existing plants. You'll find that the seeds available to the home gardener are amazingly varied and not often found in the local nurseries. As for cuttings, a gardener can increase the quantity of plants one has with little effort. We will be working with the simpler forms of propagation. This program is for the budding gardener; from age 5 to 105. Families will leave with their own future plant.
